#### **OPERATIONS**

- How many of *"those kids"* is OK?

#### STAFF TRAINING and RESOURCES

- Staff orientation must include learning the aspects of an inclusive program
- Know and use appropriate external resources in the community
- Annual "Inclusion" training will be given to all therapists and teachers



#### THE STANDARDS THEMSELVES

- There are 19 separate standards
- They are not pass/fail, but are ordinal with four ascending levels of compliance for each standard
- This is simply a roadmap for every center director to use as she sees fit



#### AND MORE...

- "But Bob, there's no magic here"
- It's not about <u>making magic</u>. It is about
  - Doing the right thing
  - Providing access for all children
  - Serving families
  - Complying with the law
  - Early care and education for all children
